Recent events and current political climate has thrust law enforcement use of force into the spotlight. Specifically, two legislative bills are working their way through the Capitol in an effort to bring about change:

- AB 392 – Changes the standard from “reasonable force” to “necessary force.”
- SB 230 – Standards for use of force policies, additional use of force training for law enforcement to include de-escalation tactics, reasonable alternatives to deadly force, rendering medical aid, an officer’s duty to intercede and prevent excessive use of force and more.

It is the opinion of the Sacramento County Law Enforcement Managers Association (LEMA) that Assembly Member Shirley Weber’s bill AB 392 is dangerous and contrary to keeping the community safe. This is essentially the same piece of legislation that failed to pass in the last legislative session. We must once again come together and work to defeat AB 392.

First, we need your support to pass SB 230. This common sense approach to positive change through adaptation of policies and additional training is an important step in enhancing our connection with the communities we serve. The time to get involved is now!
